This worksheet can be used to craft your elevator pitch. For an overview of elevator pitches, check out this handout.

NOTE: Remember that your elevator pitch should be updated to reflect your own changes and discoveries about yourself.

Directions:

- 1. Go through each section and answer the prompts that resonate with you and that you want to incorporate into your pitch.
- 2. Select 2-3 things from each section and compile them into your drafted pitch.
- 3. Refine your pitch find ways to connect each part of your elevator pitch so that it flows.
- 4. Finalize put it all together and then, practice!

STEP 1: Brainstorm

Go through each section and answer the prompts that resonate with you and that you want to incorporate your pitch. You can answer as many of the prompts as you would like + make additional notes for other things you'd like to include.

Elevator Pitch Examples:
